Snohomish County Public Works is Hosting an Open House for Five Infrastructure Projects near Lynnwood

Project locations include Alderwood Mall Parkway, Ash Way, 164th Ave SE, 36th/35th Ave W and the Interurban Trail

EVERETT, Wash., October 4, 2022 – The unincorporated Lynnwood area is one of the most densely populated in Snohomish County. Lynnwood is also a significant retail engine in the county and is expecting the arrival of light rail service in 2024. To meet traffic and pedestrian demands in the surrounding unincorporated area, Snohomish County Public Works is planning five infrastructure improvement projects. These projects are expected to go to construction during the next four plus years. The department will host an open house to present information, discuss the five upcoming projects and seek feedback from the community.

The projects are:

- Alderwood Mall Parkway improvements (SR 525 to the 16800 block – Construction is tentatively scheduled for 2024
- Ash Way improvements (18th Ave W to Admiralty Way/Gibson Rd) – Construction is to be determined based on funding availability and approval of environmental permits
- 164th St SE Overlay (Ash Way to Spruce Way) – Construction is scheduled for 2023
- 36th/35th Ave W improvements (164th St SW to State Route 99) – Construction is scheduled for 2023
- Interurban Trail Improvements (160th St SW to 167th Pl SW of Meadow Rd/13th Ave W) – Construction is tentatively planned for 2025, subject to funding availability
