Applicants Sought for Public Facilities and Infrastructure Projects Designed to Prevent, Prepare for, and Respond to the Coronavirus Pandemic

Applications for \$1,900,000 in federal funds for public facilities and infrastructure will be accepted until February 17, 2023

SNOHOMISH COUNTY, Wash., January 19, 2023- Snohomish County is encouraging nonprofit organizations and government agencies to review the Notice of Fund Opportunity (NOFO) and submit applications for public facility and infrastructure projects designed to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the direct and indirect effects of the Coronavirus pandemic, and to mitigate future risks.

Approximately \$1,900,000 in federal funds is available. Projects must primarily benefit low- and moderate - income persons or neighborhoods in Snohomish County.

Interested applicants are encouraged to attend a virtual application workshop on Wednesday, January 25, 2023, from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m.
