Snohomish County Public Works proposes to construct a sidewalk on the south side of Elgin Way. The sidewalk improvement would extend from the Elgin Way/132nd Street SE intersection to 10th Street SE. The purpose of the project is to provide accessibility that meets the current Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements. The improvements will improve pedestrian accessibility for area residents who cross 132nd Street SE/SR 96 to access the McCollum Park Park and Ride transit facility and McCollum Park which is located immediately adjacent south of the Park and Ride facility.

Pursuant to SCC 30.70.050(2), this notice is being issued for the land disturbing activity as part of this project.
