Snohomish County proposes to construct sidewalk improvements on the east side of 3rd Avenue SE where the street curves to meet with 130th Street SE. The project's sidewalk improvement would fill in an area where there is a gap in sidewalk connectivity and provide pedestrian accessibility. The purpose of the project is to provide pedestrian accessibility that meets current Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements. Improvements include replacing existing sidewalk ramps in the project vicinity and installing new ramps where needed.

Pursuant to SCC 30.70.050(2), this notice is being issued for the land disturbing activity as part of this project.
