Night Work Expected on 35th Avenue SE Between SR 96 and 116th Street SE for Road Paving

Drivers should expect delays June 29-30 and July 6-10

EVERETT, Wash., June 23, 2015 – As part of the Snohomish County Public Works Paving Program, crews will be working on 35th Avenue SE between State Route 96 (SR 96) and 116th Street SE in the Mill Creek and Everett areas in the coming weeks. To accommodate high traffic volumes during the day, work will occur throughout the night on this project with roads reopening at 5 a.m. This is the only night work currently required for roads in the 2015 Paving Program.

Paving is very weather dependent so schedules are preliminary and may change as work progresses. A message sign will be placed in advance in the area to announce when the work will begin.

Night work is currently scheduled for the following two locations:

When: Monday, June 29 to Tuesday, June 30, 2015 from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m.

Where: The intersection of 35th Avenue SE and SR 96 in Mill Creek

What to expect:

- A message sign will be displayed three days in advance of work beginning
- SR 96 and 35th Avenue SE will be temporarily modified to one lane in each direction between 8 p.m. and 5 a.m.
- Drivers should expect delays up to 20 minutes

When: Monday, July 6 to Friday, July 10, 2015 from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m.

Where: 35th Avenue SE from SR 96 to 116th Street SE in Mill Creek / Everett

What to expect:

- A message sign will be placed in the area 10 days in advance of work beginning
- Drivers should expect delays

The Paving Program focuses on preserving pavement while it is still in fair condition by placing a new layer of asphalt over the existing asphalt. Preserving a road in this manner will maintain an appropriate

level of safety, minimize damage caused by water seeping into the roadway base, and preserve the roadway investment in the most cost efficient manner.
