

Locust Way Area Improvements FAQ

14th Avenue West

Q: Where is the project located?

A: The proposed 14th Ave W Extension Project will span from 220th Street SW to Locust Way. See map for details.

Q: How long has this been planned?

A: This project has been a part of the county's Transportation Needs Report since the early 1980's. The report provides information about where improvements may be needed to Snohomish County's transportation system. A design report was conducted in 1984-1985 to assess 14th Ave W and identified the current project alignment as the recommended alternative.

Q: What is the timeline for this project?

A: Snohomish County Public Works is in the environmental review and design stages of this project.

- 2017-2022: Design, survey, environmental review, right-of-way acquisition and public involvement
- Construction is subject to funding availability

Q: Why are you doing this?

A: The Bothell, Alderwood Manor and Brier area is experiencing rapid population growth. To meet traffic and pedestrian demands, Public Works is working on multiple road improvement projects in the unincorporated county area, including this one. The purpose of this project is to improve north-south circulation and connectivity for vehicles, pedestrians and bicycles in the 14th Ave W vicinity.

Q: What are the project improvements?

A:

- Creating a two lane northerly extension, including an intersection at 14th Ave W and Locust Way
- Adding sidewalks and bike lanes
- New stormwater detention and treatment facilities

Q: Will right-of-way need to be purchased for this project?

A: As part of the extension project, Snohomish County will need to purchase right-of-way from several property owners in the area. Those property owners will be contacted by a Snohomish County Right-of-Way Agent.

Q: What is the estimated construction cost of this project?

A: The preliminary estimated cost is approximately 10 million.



Locust Way and Larch Way/Logan Road Intersection Improvement

Q: What is the timeline for this project?

A: This project is currently in the preliminary design phase. Snohomish County anticipates construction to begin in 2019-2020 pending funding availability.

Q: What are the project improvements?

A: Proposed changes to the Locust Way and Larch Way/Logan Road intersection are expected to improve traffic flow and operations. Intersection improvements may include the addition of a traffic signal with left- and right-turn pockets.

Q: Will right-of-way need to be purchased for this project?

A: As part of the intersection improvements, Snohomish County will need to purchase right-of-way from several property owners in the area. Those property owners will be contacted by a Snohomish County Right-of-Way Agent.

Q: What is the estimated cost of this project?

A: The county is currently seeking construction funding opportunities. The current estimated construction cost is approximately 2.5 million.
