

## Official Observer and Visitor Rules

All observers and visitors are expected to follow the rules below:

- Must undergo a health screening prior to entry which includes:
  - Taking your temperature with a no-contact, infrared thermometer
  - Answering the following questions:
    - Are you experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 that cannot be attributed to another health condition?
    - In the last fourteen (14) days have you been within six (6) feet of anyone (including family members) with a confirmed or suspected case of COVID-19?
- Must wear at all times a face mask that covers your nose and mouth.
- Must maintain social distance from others.
- Must check in and wear a badge at all times.
- Must not disrupt or interfere with any process.
  - Examples of interference might include obstructing voters' or staff path, engaging in conversation with voters or staff, electioneering by wearing campaign clothing or buttons while observing.
- Must not touch any machinery, equipment, supplies, or ballots.
- Must stay within the designated observer areas.
- Must not talk to or ask any questions of Elections staff.

- Must limit conversations and discussions with other observers.
- Must not take pictures or use cell phones or electronic devices.
- Must not bring food or drink into the facility.

(A closed-lid water bottle is allowed as long as it is kept away from work areas.)

- Must not record any information regarding votes on ballots.
- Must follow requests from the Auditor, Chief Deputy Auditor, Elections Manager, Elections Supervisor, or designated area lead.

If any observer or visitor cannot follow the above rules, they will be asked to leave the facility.
