Flood Response



- Emergency Coordination Center (ECC)
- Patrol
- Snohomish County Volunteer Search & rescue (Swift Water Rescue Team)
- Search & Rescue (Air Support)
- Marine & Dive



Emergency Coordination Center

- Unified Command - Special Operations Lieutenant will respond to the ECC during activation to coordinate SCSO resources as needed.
- County wide assessment.
- Direct communication with Public Works, Fire, PUD, and other active Emergency Operations Centers throughout the County.
- Monitor weather, River conditions and Tides
- Track all resources for better coordination



Patrol

- Calls for service Via SNOPAC.
- During storm events Patrol receive a high volume of calls for service.
- Patrol Deputies check and confirm reports of water over the road or lines down. If needed Public Works Dept. is notified for signage.
- Deputies assist with evacuations when required.
- The Sheriff's Office also provides contract services for 7 cities within the County. Each Contract Police Chief participates in their local EOC's.





SCVSAR – Swift Water Rescue Team

- The SCVSAR Swift Water Rescue Team is trained and equipped for flood operations.
- SRT is modeled after FEMA Type II teams, adapted for cold-water and high-water current conditions.
- SRT is on call 24/7
- The Swift Water Team deploy out of Taylors Landing.

Air Operations

- SNOHAWK 10 –1970 Bell UH-1H, Air crew of five. Hoist Equipped, Engine upgrade with service length to 2031.
- SNOHAWK 1 – 1968 Hughes 500
- National Guard Air Support







Marine / Dive

- The Snohomish County Sheriff's Office Marine & Dive Units are trained in Marine & Swift Water rescue Operations.
- During flood conditions Marine Units stage at locations throughout the County.
- Vessels assigned to the unit for flood operations include:
 - 1) 17' Safe Boat W/Jet
 - 2) 19' Aluminum boat W/Jet
 - 3) River Sled W/Jet
 - 4) 2 Personal Watercraft
 - 5) Inflatable paddle vessel
