Dear Mr. Eastin:

Thank you for contacting the Washington State Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation (DAHP). The above referenced project has been reviewed on behalf of the State Historic Preservation Officer. We request that cultural resources be taken into consideration as part of the EIS. The project area has a very high potential for containing precontact archaeological resources. Precontact artifacts have been reported on the beaches adjacent to the project area. We understand that the project area is currently developed and subsurface archaeological survey prior to demolition may not be feasible. The EIS cultural resources section should focus on background research including site development history in preparation for methodology to address cultural resources identification during demolition and redevelopment. DAHP will need to see the original cultural resources reports in addition to the summarized version of the report that will become part of the EIS.

Complete cultural resources reports, archaeological monitoring plans and cultural resource management plans must be sent to DAHP and the affected Tribes prior to any ground disturbing activities commencing, on any part of the project.

Archaeological site inventory forms must be submitted to DAHP in advance of the final report, and Smithsonian trinomials (site numbers) must be incorporated into the final report text.

Please note we consider the APE to contain staging and laydown areas as well as roads, utility lines, staging and laydown area. All of these areas should be surveyed for archaeological resources.

DAHP will review the plans or report(s) and inform the applicant when/if an excavation permit from this office is required.
