Dear Mr. MacCready,

I am a retired Boeing engineer, and with my teammates, we reviewed each case to make a final decision just like you are facing now. The difference is we were dealing with technical and cost issues, while you are dealing with a massive proposed Point Wells Development which seemingly pays little or no attention to the real impact this development will have on the county, Shoreline, Edmonds, Woodway, and beyond.

The real fact here is that Snohomish county will have to deal with whatever is built for generations to come while the Point Wells owner will build, sell, and be gone.

Generational ownership has to pay attention to the scientists concern that the ocean, as I understand it, will rise at least 4 feet in the not distant future and that storms, earthquakes etc might impact the massive support pilings sunk down under the unstable ground at the site. Can these pilings stand in the desired position for years to come? I hope the Snohomish county decision with your support will mean "no deal!"

Finally, I realize this development has been entangled in multiple legal processes over the years. It's time we just say “no deal”.

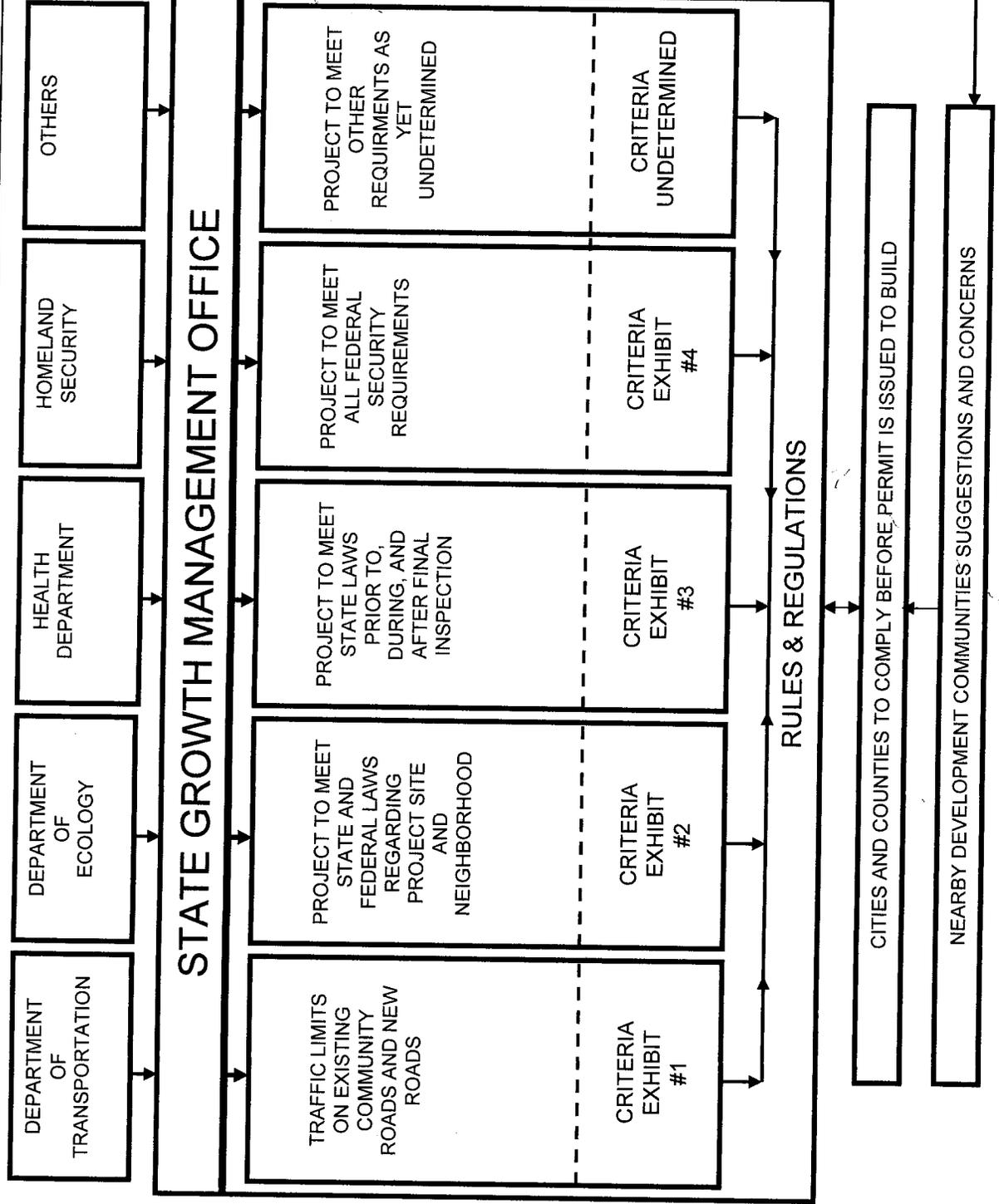
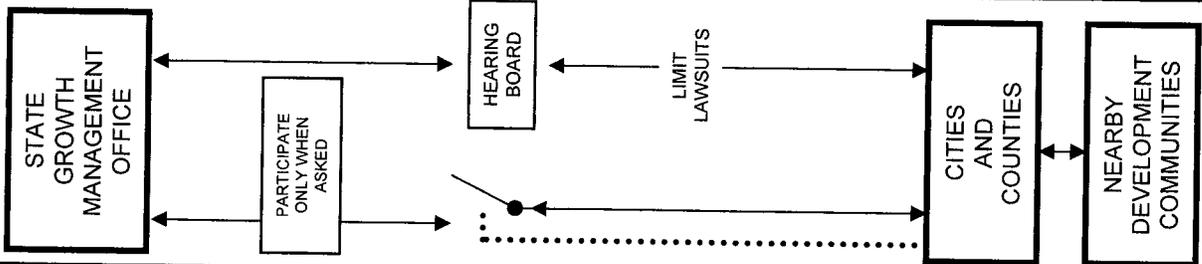
