Hi Daryl,

Our address is 17315 Evanston Ave North. I second Sally's email. Another huge concern is that the school has informed us that there is now only a few hundred parking spots for well over 1,000 students that attend Shorewood High and they are parking on Evanston Ave N now. They are tearing up the grass in front of the homes, and also parking against mailboxes. The mailman has informed us that he will *not* deliver mail if vehicles are parked within 6 feet of the mailboxes. Our business gets mail here every day and it is effecting our livelihood. **There is no parking left for our vehicles.** There is only ONE tiny "no parking during school hours" sign attached to the stop sign on the south end of Evanston Ave N, but none on northbound, so the kids and staff all park there in a crammed in jumbled mess. There are days where we literally cannot back our vehicles out of the driveway because of the amount of cars behind them. The parking on Fremont behind the school is not enforced even though there are several no parking signs, and they are parking clear up to the end of the streets, leaving no visibility to exit the neighborhood. It is very dangerous. I am also asking that more no parking during school hours signs be placed on these small roads behind the school. Homeowners do not deserve to have to host a school parking lot in front of our houses 5 days a week. Plus, it encourages the students to go to those cars during lunch (because they are hidden from the school) to smoke and then toss cigarettes all over our lawns, which we see all the time.

I live at 17321 Evanston Ave N in Shoreline, WA 98133. My property runs from Evanston down the hill to Dayton. and is a half a block from Shorewood High School and Fremont. My neighborhood is already heavily impacted by traffic

from the school but more importantly from the Richmond Beach area traffic that uses Fremont and Dayton southbound to avoid traffic on Aurora and I-5. During rush hours, there is a heavy back-up on Dayton already that often goes all the way down the hill past St Luke's where the arriving students for that school further clog up the road.

I believe that the addition of several thousand more cars coming from Point Wells will substantially increase the numbers of cars on these two neighborhood streets and decrease the safety for students walking to schools, interfere with local families trying to go and come from their homes, raise the noise levels and pollution in the areas between Dayton, Fremont and Aurora and substantially decrease home values in our area.

As far as I can tell, the planners have paid little attention to these "feeder" streets and the ways in which Point Wells will overload these neighborhoods with traffic jams, noise and pollutants. I am asking that concern about this area be more directly addressed in further planning.
