## What is the FICC?

### Family and Interagency Coordinating Council

The FICC facilitates interactive meetings that bring families and providers together in order to coordinate, collaborate, and implement interagency early childhood services.

The FICC meets quarterly and is a great opportunity to share/receive information and network with families and providers.



## Who attends the FICC?

The FICC is open to everyone who is invested in children birth to six years of age with or at risk of a delay or disability, including parents, family members, school staff and providers.

## Incentives for Families

Provides an opportunity to gain knowledge and learn about resources in the community.

Meet and network with other parents of young children and share information and resources with others.

Meet and provide feedback to professionals who provide support to young children.

Child Care available on site and limited stipends available for parent participation in meetings.
