February 12 Special Election Ballots Mailed

Everett, WA – Today ballots for the February 12 Special Election were mailed to 101,000 registered voters in Snohomish County. The election features a school bond measure for the Arlington School District and a measure to dissolve Fire District 1 now that the district is part of the South County Fire and Rescue Regional Fire Authority. Only voters in these districts will receive ballots.

Voters are encouraged to return their completed ballots as soon as practical. There are several options available for returning a ballot – through a ballot drop box, an accessible voting site, directly to the Auditor's Office, or by mail. Postage is not required regardless of how a voter returns their ballot.

Voters interested in seeing if their ballot and other mail is ready for delivery may sign up for Informed Delivery with the U.S. Postal Service. While not available in all areas of the county, Informed Delivery is a tool for some voters to anticipate the arrival of their ballot. Visit informeddelivery.usps.com to sign up.

For the February 12 Special Election, the following ballot drop box locations will be open. Boxes at these locations are available 24-hours a day until 8 p.m. on Election Day, Tuesday, February 12, and no postage is needed. Locations are:

Voters may also drop completed ballots at the Snohomish County Auditor's Office Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. with extended hours on Election Day, February 12, 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Ballots returned through the mail must be postmarked no later than February 12.

Snohomish County Elections has accessible voting equipment for voters with disabilities available in the Auditor's Office, Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Hours will be extended to 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, Tuesday, February 12. Accessible voting equipment will also be available at the Lynnwood Sno-Isle Library on Monday, February 11 from 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. and from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, February 12. The Lynnwood Sno-Isle Library is located at 19200 44th Ave, Lynnwood.
