No Access to Pilchuck River Bridge 581 During Construction

June 2016 Update

Construction has begun on Pilchuck River Bridge 581, also known as Glover's Bridge. Throughout this construction period, the work zone is closed to the public and access to the bridge will only be available to Polestar Farms.

April through November 2016

The bridge construction zone is closed to public access.

- No river access
- No pedestrian access
- No parking
- No turnaround

About the Project

Pilchuck River Bridge 581 is located on 64th Street NE in the Lochsloy community, between Lake Stevens and Granite Falls. The existing bridge was built in 1960 and is a one-lane, steel, and timber structure. The replacement bridge is being built using a steel truss design; this will eliminate the need for intermediate support piers and help to reduce debris accumulation under the bridge. The new bridge is being constructed immediately upstream of the existing bridge and will be completed by the fall of 2016.

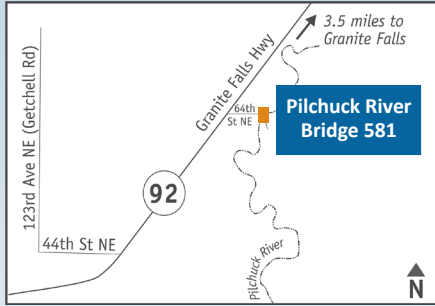
