<p>Twenty more ballots were counted than voters credited in Snohomish County.</p> <p>Snohomish County Elections identified twenty voters where a second issued and received ballot was counted due to reporting and processing issues using the new VoteWA system. Requests for bug fixes and report enhancements to address these issues have been submitted to the VoteWA team. These additional ballots did not impact the outcome of any race or issue in the election.</p> <p>The State and counties recognized at the onset of the Primary that the VoteWA system had not been tested on all processes of an election. Snohomish County remains committed to working to ensure reporting and processing accuracy with the new VoteWA system in partnership with the State VoteWA team.</p>
