Megan Dunn Sworn In As Snohomish County Councilmember

Everett, WA -- On Monday, January 6th, Megan Dunn was sworn in as the newest Snohomish County Councilmember, representing District 2. Councilmember Dunn brings with her over 20 years of professional and volunteer experience. Most recently she was the Healthy People and Communities Program Director with the Northwest Center for Alternatives to Pesticides (NCAP) and the Chair of the successful Everett Districts Now campaign which established voting districts for city council members in Everett.

During her time with NCAP, she led efforts to help protect communities from harmful pesticides and chemicals. She plans to use her extensive experience and knowledge of environmental issues to guide thoughtful policy making that will protect Snohomish County. “Snohomish County is abundant with natural beauty and we have a responsibility to protect the quality of air, water, and land so that all in Snohomish County can thrive,” said County Councilmember Dunn.

The Everett Districts Now campaign was a nonpartisan, grassroots coalition dedicated to addressing disparities in representation. As the chair of the campaign, she led the efforts which give communities greater participation in the City of Everett’s democratic process. “It is imperative that our elected officials are representative and responsive to the communities in which they serve,” said Councilmember Dunn. “I look forward to representing the people and needs of Council District 2 with careful consideration.”

Councilmember Dunn plans to focus on solutions for the improved livability, affordability, and sustainability of Snohomish County. She will be convening a transition team to decide short-term and long-term priorities.

Snohomish County Councilmember terms are for four years. District 2 of the County Council includes Tulalip, Everett, and Mukilteo.
